

- READ to RISE is a non-profit organization committed to promoting youth literacy in schools in South Africa's under-resourced communities.
- As the name indicates, we believe that children need to read in order to rise in their personal development and contribution to society.
- **Book Ownership** is important. We distribute new, high quality books that are educational, entertaining and inspirational.
- A Mini-Library is placed in classrooms, which is a bookshelf containing 50 new, ageappropriate, reading books.
- We do not just drop books and Mini-Libraries off at schools, rather, along with volunteer readers; we visit every class-room and have an interactive session.

To date we have visited **438 classrooms** and have given out **new books to 23,647 learners** and **170 Mini-Libraries** (with 8,500 books)
